Kenesaw Public Schools needs your help! The new preschool building is quickly taking shape, and very soon, it will be time to fill the classrooms with the bright and shining faces of three-, four-, and five-year-old preschool students. This is an exciting time for the Kenesaw School District, parents, preschool students, and the community as a whole. While the excitement is high with the many possibilities that the Kenesaw Early Learning Academy brings to our community, there is also a great deal of work that must take place in order to be ready for our preschool friends, come January. Because the preschool classrooms must be put together in a relatively short time span, the support of the Kenesaw community is greatly needed.

As you may be aware, Kenesaw Public Schools was lucky enough to receive the state funded Early Childhood Grant. This funding provides the school district with \$155,000 the first year of the grant and \$130,000 in years two and three. The district has used the year one funds to purchase curriculum, student chairs, tables, storage shelves, books, toys, games, and a number of other items necessary to engage preschoolers with appropriate learning opportunities.

This leads us to our need for community support. We will have many items that need put together, carried into the preschool classrooms, and arranged according to the teachers' specifications. We will also need to inventory each item for insurance purposes. With the help of the community, this task can be completed in a timely manner. It also allows members of the school and community to work together for the greater good of our school system and our children. Please consider donating some of your time and muscle to help us be prepared to educate our amazing preschool students.

Additionally, KPS will be tearing down two classrooms located in the shop. Mr. Perry would like to have more space to work on bigger projects in the Welding and Woods classes. So, if you are available for a day or two over the winter break, and you enjoy demolition, we would love to have your help with this project.
