## Introduction

- Mrs. Morgan Cline – Title I Teacher
- Bachelor's degree from University of Nebraska-Lincoln
- Teaching since 2016
  - 5 years in 4th Grade at Lincoln Public Schools
  - 2 years as the 4-6 Reading Teacher/4th Grade Teacher at Kenesaw
  - 1st year as the Schoolwide Title Teacher at Kenesaw

## Our school is now a Schoolwide Title I School

- Purpose: This program provides financial assistance to our school to help ensure that all children meet our challenging state academic standards. Kenesaw's Title I funding was used to add a full-time Title I teacher. Our funding (\$35,000) continues to go towards the annual salary of the Title I teacher.
- My role: I am here to help any student who struggles, specifically in the areas of math and reading.
- Your rights as a parent/guardian: You can request that your student receive this extra help if you are seeing that they are struggling. The best way to do this is to have a discussion with your child's classroom teacher or me about your concerns and then we can go from there. I work closely with the classroom teachers and administration, especially in analyzing the testing data we collect several times a year, to make sure all students are receiving the help they need.
- Schoolwide: Schoolwide Title I means that **all** students K-6 have access to additional support in Reading and Math based on data, classroom observations, and possible parent requests.
- Reading Curriculum: Last year was our last year of using Reading Street as our reading curriculum in Kindergarten through 6th grade. This program was adopted by Kenesaw in 2017. This year (2023-2024) will be our first year using Into Reading in Kindergarten through 6th grade. Kindergarten through 2nd grade will be using Geodes for small group instruction, and Kindergarten through 3rd grade will be using Foundations for phonics instruction.
- Math Curriculum: Bridges math series is used in Kindergarten through 5th grade and Illustrative Math is used in 6th grade. Both of these programs were adopted by Kenesaw in 2020.
- Writing Curriculum: This year (2023-2024) will be the first year Kindergarten through 6th grade will be using The Write Tools for writing instruction.
- Assessments Used: The following assessments are used to determine the needs of students along with in class performance.
  - MAP Growth - K-2nd
  - NWEA Growth - 3rd-6th
  - Star - 1st-6th
  - Acadience - Kindergarten-6th grade, three times a year
- School report card: Kenesaw Elementary Schools' 2021-2022 AQuESTT rating is currently labeled "Great" (the website has not yet updated the ratings for the 2022-2023 school year). We do not have any areas identified as "Needs

Improvement". We will continue to work on our improvement in reading, math and instruction. You can find more information about our school report card by going to the following link, or scanning the QR code:

- Paraeducators: We have a great staff of educated and dedicated paraeducators. Our paraeducators have all gone through or are currently going through Project PARA, which is a paraeducator training program, through UNL. - Parent Notices: Students receive quarterly report cards along with results of reading assessments like Acadience and MAP and staff qualifications are listed on the school website.
